NYC ARTS & CULTURE SUPPORT

New York City invests more in arts and culture than any other city in the country.

The New York City Department of Cultural Affairs (DCLA)

- Supports nearly 1,000 nonprofit cultural organizations every year
- Provides over \$330 million for art and culture this year
- Commissions permanent public artworks by individual artists through Percent for Art—more than 330 completed to date
- Diverts 1.5 million pounds of materials from the waste stream each year and redirects them to nonprofit cultural organizations and public schools
- Hosts individual artists in residence at other City agencies through Public Artists in Residence (PAIR)
- Expands access to arts and culture through special initiatives like IDNYC cultural benefits, Social Impact of the Arts mapping project, and an ongoing workforce and audience diversity initiative

The **NYC Department of Education** spent \$368 million on arts education in public schools in 2014-2015.

Arts programs are offered throughout City government including the **NYC Department of Parks, Department of Sanitation, Department of Transportation, New York Public Libraries, Department for the Aging, Department of Corrections, and many more.**
